The Importance of Speaking and Listening (Considering the interplay between Monarchs and Prophets)

Nuneaton Christian Fellowship - January and February 2017

Some questions to ask ourselves:

Take your time when you consider these questions. Perhaps ponder on each one for a few days before you move onto the next one. It might be useful to seek God by praying with someone.

- * Who do we listen to? How much time do we spend listening to these different people/things? What/who gets most of my attention during the average day? How does this affect me?
- * How easy is it to listen to God? What can I do to make it easier to hear God speak to me? What will this involve? Am I prepared to do this whatever the cost?
- * Who listens to me? How can I ensure that what I say is usually beneficial to others? How can I speak 'prophetically' to those around me? What does this mean? Am I obedient when God prompts me to speak to others (whether an individual or a group)?
- * How much do I pray for and actively encourage NCF's leaders? Do I go out of my way to be positive and helpful to others?
- * How are the Books of Kings written differently to the Books of Chronicles?
- * Are the main characters (apart from God) the Kings or the Prophets?
- * List some of the main reasons that many of the Kings were evil. What did this stem from?
- * How did the Kings react to the Prophets? How do I respond to God when He talks to me?
- * How different are my attitudes, beliefs and actions to the Kings I have read about? Does anything need to change? What will be my initial step? When will I do this?
